Even in this weary, tired world, everyone there gave of themselves and realized yet again the truth of what Jesus taught us, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" *Acts* 20-:35. Yes, Christmas will come again this year whenever we give—not only because of the need but because we realize that's the only way we're the happiest!

NAVAJO CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS MISSION, DEC 1

On one of the most beautiful December days we've ever seen at Leupp, Arizona 30 FaithWorks volunteers gathered for our annual Christmas gift give-away for the Navajo children! Thank you for your prayers for good weather—it was gorgeous! The team members were from 9 different churches from Camp Verde, Sedona, Williams and Flagstaff. They brought gifts, food, and a lot of love for our Navajo friends.

Pastor Dean and Lola cooked turkey and ham, and all the missioners provided the potluck "fixings" including loads of cupcakes! The *FaithWorks* team served the meal to our friends with love and respect. Then when all were served, we sat down and ate with them and visited about our mutual lives. Oh what a wonderful feast!

After unloading the Trinity van and *FaithWorks* trailer of gifts, the gifts totaled somewhere around 570! Praise the Lord! So many of you gave and sent gifts which were so gratefully accepted.

About 30 Navajo friends showed up, and most of them were children. Santa Claus gave a wonderful talk about how good it is to give *and* receive. He instructed the children that after they received their gift they were to go choose another gift for someone in their family or anyone they knew who didn't have one. The children really got into the giving mood.

The excess gifts will be taken by Pastor Dean and Lola to two other Chapter Houses on the Navajo Reservation where there are very needy people who do not have any money to buy gifts for their families. One lady told me that she is caring for her five grandchildren while her son is in prison, and she had no money for Christmas. After all her grandchildren received gifts, we told her to choose one for herself! She was so surprised and said, "No, I can't choose, you choose for me." So one of the team members picked out a lovely wrapped box and gave it to her. After she opened it she was in tears because she said she had been praying for a new blouse and that's just what it was! And it was even the peach color she wanted! She immediately thanked God, and so did we!

It was a day of new friendships, reuniting with old ones, laughing children, Santa Claus, good food, and a few tears. It was a day many *FaithWorks* team members will remember for a very long time, and we know that a lot of our Navajo friends will too!

Lola Bahe the wife of Pastor Dean Bahe called us the very next morning after the Christmas Mission trip to share with us how happy she was about what had happened at her church during the Christmas gathering.

Lola told us a couple of stories about how most of the Navajos who came to the Christmas celebration were not Christians—they had heard there were going to be gifts and free food at the church, so they came, and afterwards they thanked her, telling her they had had the best time ever, had never felt so loved, and were thinking about coming to church the next day!

Dean and Lola wanted to let us know how thankful they were to God and to the *FaithWorks* mission team for coming, sharing, and giving their time, love and faith to their little flock of folks that live in their community.

DUAL MISSION TRIPS TO THE NAVAJO RESERVATION

On October 13, two one-day mission teams traveled to the Navajo reservation and gathered on a beautiful day to work at two different churches.

One mission group, made up of sixteen missioners from two different churches in Williams and Flagstaff, went to the Church of God Holiness at Grand Falls Station near Leupp to do some much-

Grand Falls Station near Leupp to do some muchneeded repairs and new construction for the church. The team painted, worked on a roof, repaired a ceiling, installed new
kitchen flooring, and completely rebuilt an outhouse. Pastors Dean and Lola Bahe served Navajo tacos for lunch and were
very appreciative of all the work and love that was put into their facilities that day. A few team members even returned on
another day to finish up the work that was left undone. Now *that's* the mission spirit!

The second group, comprised of ten folks from five different churches from Flagstaff and Overgaard, gathered at the Cedar Springs Nazarene Church in Dilkon, Arizona, an hour-and-a-half drive east of Flagstaff. Despite the long drive for many, they arrived fresh, good-spirited, and ready to work. The pastor, Mike Winslow, had also encouraged his congregation to come and have a church workday, serving alongside the FaithWorks servants, so they all enjoyed each



other's company in "serving together." They got a lot of cleaning, painting, and repairs done as well as good fellowship with all the different people helping. All were encouraged by how much they were able to get accomplished on that one-day mission.


Please continue to keep both these churches and all the people they help in your prayers. Because of the extreme poverty and

January 19

El Nathan Ministries, Flagstaff, AZ

Right in the city limits is a Christian campground/retreat center that few know about. We'll work inside the facility providing much needed fix-up to help their ministry.

February 21-24

Agua Prieta Medical Mission, Sonora, Mexico

We'll continue to assist in the free provisions of medical/ dental/optometrist care and medicines just south of the U.S. border

March 9

Verde Vaelley, Rimrock, Central Arizona

The Olive Branch is a Christian ministry to physically and mentally disabled adult men. We will provide building fix-up, painting & cleaning alongside the resident men.

March 30

Living Water Retreat Center, Cornville, AZ

This long-standing facility is a destination for Christian pastors and leaders to come & 'recharge' their batteries. We will help this ministry with painting and fix-up.

May 4

Habitat for Humanity, Williams, AZ

We'll send 15 willing servants to help those elderly or needy people in building fix-up and painting. Director Bud Parenteau will coordinate our efforts to bless this community at the "Gateway to the Grand Canyon."

May 16-19

Agua Prieta Medical Mission, Sonora, Mexico

For the second time in 2013 we will send a medical / dental team on mission to Agua Prieta, Mexico for a 2-day ministry.

June 7-9

Western Indian Ministries, Window Rock, AZ

This weekend mission trip will be like a family vacation – but with a purpose! We'll do building fix-up & encourage Steve & Katrina Marti, missionaries to this historical Navajo Indian Ministry.

July 4-18

The African Medical Ministry Mission

For a 7th year, we'll partner with Christians in Tanzania, near Mt. Kilimanjaro in East Africa, by sending a mission team comprised of medical workers to assist in relieving the suffering of this HIV/AIDS ravaged community in Karatu, very near Kenya. We will also do pastoral support and children's ministry at the clinic.

August 17-25

Chugiak, Alaska

This team of 15 persons will travel inland 23 miles from Anchorage in order to provide 'fix-up' for Birchwood Camp, a valuable facility that serves the entire community

October 12

Navajo Construction Mission, Leupp, AZ

Our Navajo neighbors deeply appreciate the building repair we've supplied for 12 years. Please join us.

November 21-24

Agua Prieta Medical Mission, Sonora, Mexico

For the third time this year we will send a medical /dental team on mission to Agua Prieta, Mexico for ministry.

December 7

Navajo Children's Christmas Mission, Leupp, AZ

Our 13th annual Christmas ministry to Navajo children and families, just a short drive 30 miles north of Flagstaff.

FAITHWORKS AND AFRICA

PaithWorks is continuing to follow the Lord's call to Africa by coming alongside Winnes Masawi and Pastor Robert Temba (who happen to be brothers) in their ministries to the poor, crippled and elderly in their church and surrounding area. Winnes Massawi saw a great need for helping the elderly in his church and family many years ago. We met them on our very first mission to Tanzania in 2004. At that time Winnes had a couple of tents and a large covered eating area with a dirt floor. Through earnest prayer, he formulated plans to build a safari camp where tourists could stay while visiting the Serengeti, then he would use the proceeds from the camp towards feeding and caring for the elderly. We encouraged him and his business partner Ishmael and began to pray with them for this to come about. As we continued our missions to Tanzania, we would stop in and visit with Winnes and Ishmael and saw the miraculous transformation that God was doing for them. The camp started slowly, then grew and improved dramatically. As FaithWorks has been blessed with designated funds, we have passed them on to these fine gentlemen for furthering their work at what is now called Havennature Safari Camp in Karatu, Tanzania.

If you have been on a FaithWorks Africa mission, vou will no doubt remember Havennature and the meager beginnings it had. They now have a very nice, worldknown safari camp catering to people on safari from around the globe. The proceeds they make from this camp are then put into the Christian care and feeding of the elderly, crippled, and poor in the area. Pastor Temba makes daily house calls to people that are home-bound, bringing them a little food, sometimes medicines that we help in providing, and always an encouraging word from the Lord. Winnes has built a soup kitchen at the camp itself that provides food at least three times a week for those who can make the walk t - is planning a medical mission to this camp July 4-18, 2103, holding a free clinic offering free medications for at least a week. We need to take at least one doctor, some nurses, and other helpers to make this mission worthwhile. If you have any of these talents and/or just a love for the African people, *please* let us know soon. We need to get started on recruiting and getting all the paperwork started early. Finding a doctor who can commit to a mission trip for this length of time has been particultly challenging. A doctor on the team is necessary for the mission trip to proceed, and a lack of one has been the reason we have been unable to have a mission trip to Africa the past two years. There is so much work to be done in Africa, and we feel a certain "tug" to start again here at Havennature. Won't you pray about joining us?

MEXICO MEDICAL MISSION TRIP

On Thursday November 15th 14 enthusiastic team members headed south to the border at Douglas, AZ. We had a few glitches at the Motel 6 as usual but sailed across the border both directions without incident on both clinic days. The beautiful, loving people at the Colonia of Agua Prieta were so happy to see us! The waited patiently for hours often with many children in tow. Our patients though ill always greeted us with warm smiles and hugs. They came to receive medicine, but I think of it as medical hope! Perhaps for some new patients this was their first experience with a caring doctor or nurse. These grateful people have many needs due to the lack of affordable care where they live. We are humbled by their appreciation and love for us even though we sometimes see cases for which we can offer no cure. All total, 201 patients were seen and 92 patients received dental care from our wonderful local dentist there. Some of the medical problems encountered were sore throats, bad colds, tooth and gum problems, and various stomachaches and muscle pains. A challenging case was that of a young man who suffered a severe head injury with resulting paralysis. Our doctors and nurses and pharmacy assistants worked tirelessly to make sure that each and every man, woman and child was seen before the day is over. Many children who otherwise would not see a doctor at all were cared for. Hearts and souls were blessed on both sides of the border, reminding us again that God's love knows no borders! Thank you for your prayers for this mission trip, and please continue to keep in your prayers the humble people of Agua Prieta who teach us so much about community, love, and living life simply with gratitude.

We have been able to keep our expenses below budget for the 11-month period by \$3,925, but our revenues are also below budget by \$5,363. If God puts it on your heart to help with this shortage, it would be so appreciated as *FaithWorks* continues His work in the coming months. Please remember that *FaithWorks* is a non-profit 501(c3) organization and that your donations are tax deductible.

In addition to the General Operating Fund we have received \$17,229 from Jan 1-Nov 30, 2012 in funds designated for special projects! These include our projects in Africa, Mexico, New Mexico, Alaska, the Navajo Reservation, and various other local mission projects. 100% of these funds go as requested to the designated projects.

Again, we thank you for your heart for missions and for reaching out to a needy, hurting world.
