

LIGHT THAT DOESN'T HURT OUR EYES


The Bible says, "God is light and in Him is no darkness at all." (*I John 1:5*)

different small group sessions to learn from and participate in. This will be an annual event, so please keep it in mind for June, 2016.










AFRICAN CHICKEN-PROJECT

THE 2015 ALASKA MISSION—PRICELESS!

How much did it cost to send the Alaska Mission Team? The mission team this year boiled down from 12 to 9 folks from 5 different churches from the "lower 48." The team, bound for Anchorage, Alaska, left on Aug. 9th, returning Aug. 17 after six days of hard work assisting in building and furnishings repair at a local church and providing new construction for needy families at a *Habitat 4 Humanity* site in Anchorage, where we have sent mission teams in the past.

Just one of the partial work day logs reads, "Kitchen floor tile laid; window replaced; pews cleaned and repaired; carpet cleaned; repaired damaged drywall; cleaned kitchen oven, baseboards, cabinets...etc."

The host site evaluation included this remark about one of the fine qualities of our team: "Took our (Alaska) quality and safety standards as their own."

It's always great to get the exact comments from individual missioners about their experience on mission: "Further confirmed for me that giving is better than receiving"... "I was totally surprised at the strength I had to separate a piece of plywood from the styrofoam insulation. Awesome!"... "I was surprised by the appreciation we were shown and the faith shared among our team" ... "What this mission did for me spiritually is to prove that God places ideas at the right time" ... "My most memorable experience was meeting a young man at Habitat who will move into one of the houses we worked on" ... "made me realize that God puts together the missioners He needs to do the work" ... "seeing a family man help work on his own home given by Habitat, for his future... watching the joy on his face as the talked about it."

Now that's the kind of Alaska stuff that's *priceless*!
