
When things seemed that they could not get worse, God appeared in a surprise! Let me remind us all: the greatest darkness cannot defend itself against the smallest light.

A VERY BLESSED NAVAJO CHRISTMAS MISSION

This year our annual Christmas mission for the Navajo people on December 5th took on a very different light. Still partnering with Pastors Dean and Lola Bahe, we also included Pastor Daniel Chee from The Ranch Church in Leupp, Arizona. Pastor Daniel has a 400+ person, circuslike tent that he uses for revivals and "camp meetings," and he offered to pitch it right in the town of Leupp where it could be seen by all who passed on their way through this part of the Navajo reservation.

We had planned on at least 200 Navajos and all totaled we estimate we had 350 or more!

The FaithWorks team was comprised of 38 members from 10 different churches. The Ranch Church supplied the turkeys, and we brought all the fixings for the common meal we shared. Generous donors had been bringing gifts to the FaithWorks office all of November. We figured we had somewhere between 250 and 300 gifts. So, a big thank you goes out to all who contributed to this blessed event, either in gifts or donations for gifts.

Santa showed up and the children were delighted. We had a wonderful Christmas message by Pastor Daniel, Navajo music, carol singing, good food & fellowship!

One of the last Navajo Code Talkers was in attendance along with the widow of another Code Talker—a very unique and special part of our history with our Navajo neighbors.

Pastor Daniel Chee said, "What was so good was to see so very many new people who were there! Some came who were associated with Traditional Native customs and may have never heard the truth of the Bible Christmas story of how Jesus was born."

Many of the "elderlies" (seniors) of the Navajo nation received warm, homemade blankets and throws for the cold winter ahead.

Then on the other end of the spectrum, there was a baby boy only 20 days old in a beautiful traditional cradle board. He received a gift as well, including diapers!

Everyone was fed and ministered to in a very loving and caring way. It was certainly a Blessed Christmas Mission we will not soon forget. We pray that the Lord will continue to bless the Navajo Nation.

THE MEXICO MEDICAL MISSION: BIG THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES

A fter 12 years of serving in Mexico, FaithWorks made its 39th medical mission there on Nov. 20-21. We started out with a team of 13 and ended up with a team of 9 due to sickness and other circumstances causing cancelations. We were a small but *mighty* package!

It was a thrill to have Dr. Aguirre, a first-time local doctor from Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico, join us the second day of our clinic. As well, we were blessed again to have with us Dr. Ada Orosco, a dentist in Mexico. As a result, our team of four doctors and one dentist saw over 270 patients in the two-day free clinic!

While we are in Agua Prieta for the clinic, our teams purchase coffee that is processed and packaged by the Fuente de Vida Church. We also buy homemade tortillas made by the ladies of the church. In this way we are helping them support themselves and the church outreach in that area of Agua Prieta.

Many thanks to Pastora Gela for her blessed ministry to the people of the *Colonia Empacadora* and for welcoming FaithWorks to come and serve alongside her and her church four times a year.

Thank you for all your prayers and financial support throughout the years. We might seem like a small "package" of folks when we are reduced in number, but with God's power and Spirit directing us, we are used in a mighty way each time we go south of the Border!
