What's the difference in being "safe" or "secure?" How do we square what the Apostle Paul said "Endure hardship as a good soldier of Jesus Christ..." (2Tim 2:3) with Jesus' teaching, "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me" (Mt. 5:11)? Is "hardship" just because life happen and "persecution" something that comes deliberately from other people? of increasing difficulties for those Christians seeking to be on missions internationally. Money problems, family conflict, strain at the workplace, sickness, and various other issues come against us. As well, we're in the midst of a massive cultural shift in America, leaving Christians to wonder what's next? Many dangers lurk around the corner. in the Scriptures, we could easily lose the distinction between "safe" and "secure" as we're moving forward in Gods' Kingdom work. We will go through times of testing and trial. "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall! But, no trial has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tested beyond what you can bear. But when you are tested, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it" (1 Cor. 10:12-13). we're always safe. I've been "detained" by the government in Tanzania, had thousands of dollars worth of medicines and supplies confiscated in Mexico, and endured personal hate-filled slander from persons in America. Hard stuff! But, even though feeling unsafe at these moments, I had the assurance of security-that God had grasped me and that he would see me through for His purpose. The same will be true for you too!

SEPTEMBER MEXICO MEDICAL EQUIPMENT MISSION

 $\mathbf{\Gamma}$ or the second year now we have made a separate Γ mission trip to Agua Prieta, Mexico, to deliver goods that have been donated to FaithWorks. This additional trip to the border enables us to have more time to devote to the patients at the clinic during our medical mission trip rather than transporting and organizing additional supplies. Six volunteers loaded the FaithWorks van and trailer with hospital items, clothes, medicines, etc. and brought them to the rented storage unit in Douglas, Arizona that we have rented for just this purpose. Later, these items will be transported over the border to the Agua Prieta hospital and the Fuente de Vida Clinic where we send a treatment team three times a year. Many thanks to all who contributed!
