When 14 people from 10 different churches get together for international medical missions, anything can happen as they cross the Mexico Border! "What if....." can tend to cause concern. But, when "In God WE Trust" is in our hearts (and on our dollars!), we find that it just keeps getting better and better!

On this, our 45th Mexico medical mission in 17 years, we were thrilled to see God's blessings!

Our docs saw 172 medical patients in 2 days of treatment and our dentist saw 92 patients, which brought us to a total of 264 people that were touched by Christian medical professionals and their support team. Better than ever!

In addition, what a treat to see other parts of the mission getting better and better too. We were blessed with some "first-timers" – Grandpa Bob and Grandma Polly Philpott going with us and scholarshiping their NAU pre-med granddaughter Jacy, so she could get some hands-on experience; my long-time friend of 48 years Jay Orr from Maricopa went along to provide the 6 excellent devotionals we have with the team (he and the Philpotts also painted the run-down "computer room" so as to provide an adult education center at the Fuente de Vida Clinic); Dr. Richard Neff of Flagstaff Medical Center provided excellent care for our beloved patients; also, new nursing student Chanell MacRae from Ashfork, Arizona shadowed with the docs (we just got news she's now accepted at Yavapai College, YAY!)

You bet! We love to see all the newness. It just keeps getting "Better and Better!"

TRANSPORTED THROUGH TIME DONATED VEHICLE TO NAVAJO MINISTRY




