BIGGER BARNS AND CHRISTMAS!

Seems the US economy is roaring back! Consumer confidence is at the highest in years! New car sales are booming! The DOW is breaking records! Large parcels of land in Flagstaff that have sat vacant for decades have the heavy equipment of commercial development crawling all over them! Christmas shopping (and traffic) is going great guns! Three cheers for it all!

But, there's a word of caution. The Bible is clear and crisp in the good news of Luke 12. It's chock-full of wealth management advice from Jesus. One version heads this passage "Discerning The Times." Verses 16-21 lay out the classic passage entitled "The Parable of the Rich Fool." It describes an agricultural businessman who has more wealth built up than he knows what to do with. That's the "rich" part. Then, consulting only with himself, "What shall I do?" he embarks on a self-centered, selfabsorbed, ego trip that ends in outlandish, conspicuous consumption which he justifies by coining for himself his



ominous pronouncement from our Eternal Savior, "Thou Fool!" (That's the "Fool" part). Why? "He chose to lay up treasure for himself and was not rich towards God!" (v.21)



And so, you may ask, "your point?" Well, in light of what becomes for us an annual American Christmas spending orgy, this earthly story telling a heavenly truth can be very instructive.

You and I can take several truths from this gem of Scripture at Christmas time. First, there's nothing wrong with "bigger barns" – just don't forget God in the process. The Bible says, "To whom much has been given, much will be required." *Luke 12:48*

Second, our stewardship of "things" is important in this life and influences the next.

Contrast "Bigger Barns" to that "Tiny Stable" in Luke 2, where a Father gave Christmas away for all of us. That first Christmas was a completely sacrificial act of God giving up and giving us a Son that changed the world forever!

Be careful of bigger barns. And use whatever wealth you have now, this Christmas, to do good for someone who would never have that unless you gave.

THE CHURCH HAS LEFT THE BUILDING – AGAIN!

n November 9-12, yet another Mexico medical mission was a joyful and successful experience of Christians joining together across denominational lines to express the Gospel of Jesus Christ in both word and action.

This was our 47th Mexico medical mission in 17 years, comprised of 15 missioners from 9 different churches across Arizona. Dr. Bill Austin served as the pediatrician, Dr. Rick Brothers provided primary care for adults, and Camelia Gembala was our excellent female healthcare provider. R.N. Gigi Sorenson organized and served in the pharmacy. Our other two nurses, Linda VanDeren and Faye Willis both retired and longtime missioners with FaithWorks did a great job *again* in the triage room.

And once again, we had two wonderful Mexican dentists on site that joined us for both days of the clinic. Kathy Marvin, a retired teacher from Sierra Vista, came self-contained to care for and teach the Mexican children coming to the clinic, utilizing her outstanding skills in art and music. Along with Kathy came Anita Oquita, also from Sierra Vista. She serves as an excellent interpreter for the team.

Two committed Christian servants, Bud and Barbara Parenteau, came all the way from Williams (near the Grand Canyon) to deliver 15 bicycles donated by the Williams Police Dept! The bikes are intended to help with transportation to jobs in Agua Prieta.

All in all, together the team treated 288 medical and dental patients, ministered to over 100 kids, distributed over 90 Beanie Babies, encouraged the young, emerging Mexican church leaders and made some needed clinic building repairs – again!

We continue to see new faces on our missions too. Amy Casali and her daughter Emily assisted in a variety of valuable ways as did Margo Braman from Sedona who gave of herself in many needed clerical tasks. Her church in Sedona gave a "carload" of much-needed supplies too!

It continues to amaze us and fill our hearts with gratitude when we see the "church leave the building" and go into the world, serving in self-sacrificing ways, glorifying the Lord Jesus Christ!

CHRISTMAS IN NAVAJOLAND

Just north of Flagstaff is the vast and beautiful high desert mesa country where the Navajo people live. John Wayne said, "It's where God put the west!"

For 17 Christmases now, we've followed God's prompting to send mission teams there to places like Joseph City, Antelope Hills, and now for the last many years to the wonderful people of Leupp.

Each year God blessed in unique ways, confirming His promise of his "Co-Mission" with us in *Matthew 28* that if "we would go, he would be with us always..."

This year on Saturday December 2, 34 missioners from 12 different churches divided into service teams at the Grand Falls Church of God Holiness for providing a common meal, fellowship, singing, testimonies and gift-giving. The Flagstaff Family Food Bank provided 10 turkeys for the dinner. Team members brought all the donated and pre-cooked "fixins." One returning team member donated and cooked on-site Dutch oven Cowboy Beans. Other team members wrapped, rewrapped and sorted out the 375 donated Christmas presents.

One of our Verde Valley churches donated over 117 gifts! Another 37 came from yet another church, and yet another church gave an outright gift of \$300 to buy any gifts needed for the children.

One Flagstaff church gave FaithWorks 87 Bibles to give one to each Navajo family that came. FaithWorks also purchased and donated four brand new dining tables for their fellowship hall.

One family donated a Christmas tree which the team put up, decorated and lighted for their Worship Center.

I wish you could have seen our team Santa at work (or *was* it work?) In his day-job he's a heavy equipment owner/operator/ excavator, but he comes to life when it's Christmas with the Navajo kids. Blessing and praying over each one. He was well received with smiles, giggles and just a couple of tears.

There was plenty of food, carol singing in Navajo and English, Scriptures read and sharing of the Good News. When we left at the end of the celebration it really did seem like we all experienced anew where "God put the West!" Especially at Christmas Time!
