PACKING A LOT OF FUN INTO ONE DAY

On April 7, FaithWorks had its mission to the Flagstaff Family Food Bank. There were 12 volunteers from six different churches. We were able to accomplish many tasks, including:

- Checking people in who were picking up food boxes and loading the boxes into their cars. We were able to serve 30 people.
- Repackaging bulk foods from 45 pound bags to smaller bags that could be packed into food boxes.
- Striping the parking lot to keep people from parking in the loading zone and designating a truck parking for the FFFB delivery truck.
- Sorting Gaylords for the upcoming Postal food drive.
- Cleaning out the produce walk-in cooler.
- Reattaching the garage door seal, which had been halfway knocked off.
- Stacking Pallets and crates.
- Amy runing the baler, which compresses cardboard for recycling into 1000 lb bales.

Also one of the many tasks that day was packing food boxes that would be distributed to those in need in our community. With some help from Monica, the Director at Flagstaff Family Food Bank, and Tim, the Warehouse Manager, we soon had a production line set up to put the food boxes together. It started with making the boxes. The empty boxes were then sent down a conveyor where the rest of the team was ready to stuff the boxes with nonperishable food items. The boxes were then sealed and stacked onto pallets. The FaithWorks team was able to make 360 food boxes that day – Food boxes that would help feed those in need. Praise the Lord! It is amazing how God uses ordinary people to accomplish "extra ordinary" things, providing for those in need.

Monica told us that we were welcome to come and help volunteer at the Flagstaff Family Food Bank throughout the week, whenever we have a little spare time.

Thank you to all who helped in our mission, and thank you, Flagstaff Family Food Bank, for all the great work that you do serving our community.
