The Bible tells us "Be happy in your faith at all times. Never stop praying. Be thankful, whatever the circumstances may be." *I Thessalonians 5:16*.



January 19 - Flagstaff Family Food Bank, Flagstaff, AZ Repairs and fix-up. February 14-17 - Mexico Medical Mission

Need medical professionals and children's workers for this 2-day clinic in Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico.

March 9 - El Nathan Ministries, Flagstaff, AZ Fix-up and repairs.

April 13 - The Abide House, Camp Verde, AZ Light construction and repairs.

May 16 -19 - Mexico Medical Mission 2nd medical mission to Agua Prieta, Mexico this year. Doctors, nurses, helpers for a two-day clinic.

June 8 - Sunshine Rescue Mission, Flagstaff, AZ Cleaning, organizing, painting.

August 17-25 - Chugiak, Alaska Camp fix-up - painting, cleaning, roofing, gardening. September 5-8 - Mexico Medical Equipment Supply Mission We'll take up to 6 volunteers to

deliver, set up, and arrange medical equipment and supplies to Agua Prieta, Mexico.

October 12 - Navajo Fix-up Mission, Leupp, AZ Building fix-up and repair on the Reservation.

Oct 31-Nov 3 Mexico Medical Mission Providing a free clinic in Agua Prieta, Mexico to those in need.

December 7 - Navajo Children's Christmas Mission, Leupp, AZ. We will provide gifts, dinner and the love of Christ to our Navajo neighbors.

CONSTRUCTION IS IN THE AIR

On October 13th Faithworks was able to muster a hardy crew to go to the Navajo Church of God Holiness Church in Leupp, Arizona. Our crew consisted of 13 people from 5 different churches, from Flagstaff, Camp Verde, and Casa Grande, Arizona. We were there to help with a number of small construction projects that needed fixing.

It started on a beautiful crisp autumn day, with the sun shining on our faces. We got to work replacing the roof over the entrance to the Fellowship Hall, repairing doorknobs and swing sets, weeding the grounds, cleaning inside the building, and of course...painting! We were able to bless Pastor Dean & Lola Bahe, and Lola blessed us with homemade Navajo Tacos for lunch, praise the Lord!

We were able to complete our tasks for the day, but please keep the Fellowship Hall in your prayers as they will be needing a new roof sometime soon. It is our hope and prayer that we will be able to replace the entire roof so that it will be leak free and structurally sound. Several founding missionaries of the church, from when the church was built in the 1970's, arrived while the mission team was working on the roof. The founding missionaries were thrilled at the work being done, and we would all like to help preserve this structure into the future. SOLAR OVEN CLINIC

Our second attempt at a two-day solar oven clinic in Leupp, Arizona was quite a success! While our July dates had to be rescheduled due to cloudy weather, the sun shone bright and strong on our September 11-12 clinic days – thank you for your prayers!

We want to thank Pastor Lola Bahe and Solar Oven Partners for joining with FaithWorks to hold this clinic. It was such a great success, we look forward to helping with this ministry again next year!
