
#### **SMALL MIRACLES**

On February 14th FaithWorks took a team of 13 people from 9 different churches to Agua Prieta, Mexico, for a medical mission that included evaluating and treating 138 patients, and providing dental care for another 120 patients. Our last visit to Mexico, in November 2018, found us visiting a homebound man named Francisco, "Pancho," who was in need of a specialized wheelchair so that he could go outside, as he has been homebound for many years. We did not have much luck coming up with a wheelchair for Francisco until just recently. We were out on the Navajo Reservation doing some demolition work for our friend and partner in ministry, Lola Bahe, who is setting up a "Gift Shop," where she will be distributing all of the donations that she receives from FaithWorks to those in need. With two weeks to go before the Mexico Medical mission trip, we found Francisco's wheelchair in the old trading post that Lola is renovating. She immediately agreed to donate the wheelchair for Francisco, we brought it to Dr. Austin, and he had it cleaned and tuned up so it would be ready to go! Praise God for the small miracles that happen every day; they can make such a big difference for those in need.

We celebrated another small miracle when we had our Mission trip to the Flagstaff Family Food Bank. I met with the Director, Monica Foos, before the mission trip to discuss what we would be doing while we were there. Monica mentioned in passing that she would like to see a mural someday, on a large blank wall just inside of the Food Bank. I contacted a local artist, my son in law, Andrew Pavlik about the possibility of painting the mural. Andrew accepted the challenge and has produced a one-of-a-kind mural that will be the focal point for the Flagstaff Family Food Bank and a place where future volunteers will get their photos taken. The mission trip to the Flagstaff Family Food Bank had 16 people from five different churches who were able to put together 838 snack bags, 416 food bags, put up a tool rack, and distribute food to 75 families who showed up for food that day, along with starting the work on the mural. I thank God, all the time, for being a witness to the great work that gets done, with all of our FaithWorks partners.

#### NOW - BACK TO AFRICA

The one remaining part of Tony and Amy Casali's training in the "2018 Succession/Transition Plan" was to take them to Africa to introduce them to our very important partners there, Winnes Massawe and Pastor Robert Temba, with whom we've worked since 2006. Our busy schedules were so crammed that we couldn't fit that in 2018.

So, now, it's back to Africa, March 14-23, 2019. Joining us will be Tony & Amy's daughter Emily, Kelly Campbell our FaithWorks office manager, and Karen Bradford our Board of Directors' secretary.

Our itinerary will be busy, taking advantage of every day and hour we have in Tanzania. We'll be based at Havennature, the Christian Safari Camp in Karatu. There, we'll tour and dedicate "The Chicken Project," an extensive ministry plan for meat and eggs to supply needed protein to the poor and elderly nearby. We've been blessed to send \$17,000 to support this effort in recent years.

We'll inspect the on-site medical clinic facility and tour two nearby hospitals for future mission possibilities.

One of the highlights of our trip is to visit Jacob's Well, the long-awaited freshwater well that's been drilled. Also, to participate in the public dedication for the well, which will serve the surrounding community.

We'll do home visits with Pastor Temba to whom we've sent consistent financial support for helping the sick, poor, disabled and elderly.

On the return trip home, Tony will lead the team back to the USA. Jan and I will detour to France, at our personal expense, for a week to retrace where my father served in WW1, visit Normandy and enjoy Paris.

We are so very blessed to be able to make this final trip back to Africa for us, turning over the bright future of Tanzanian Mission Ministry to Tony and Amy, helping them with a strong start!
